

## MAINTENANCE TECHNICIAN

Reports to the Manager/Director of maintenance. Is responsible for troubleshooting, repairing and servicing aircraft including engines, engine systems, and airframe components to ensure aircraft remains in safe operating condition. Tests, adjusts and replaces parts such as tires, wiring, and instruments using various test equipment, technical diagrams, maintenance manuals, and mechanics' tools. Fuels and grooms the aircraft, inflates tires and fills gasoline and oil tanks. The duties of a maintenance technician include:

- Performing inspections, preventive maintenance, trouble- shooting and replacement of parts on the aircraft
- Maintaining shop and hangar tools and equipment
- Ensuring compliance with ADs

## Minimum Qualifications:

- a) An A&P certificate
- b) Associate or higher College degree (recommended but not necessary)
- c) Having 2 years total experience as an active aircraft maintenance technician with experience in the type of aircraft assigned
- d) Having completed manufacturer's training in the company's aircraft and powerplant (recommended but not necessary)
- e) Continuing Education
- f) Computer literate
